CAMPUS PROFILES.

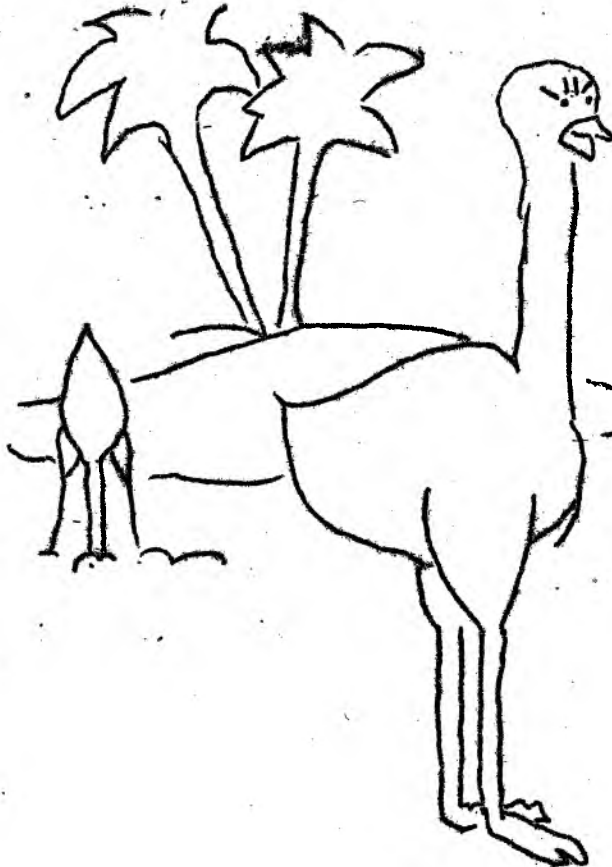
Dean John, known to most students as "Smokey," is nineteen years old, has dark hair, brown eyes, and stands 5' 10".
