EDITORIAL

The second clection under the Northvestern Michigan College-body constitution took place yesterday in one of the best conducted campaigns ever to take place at N.C.

Intense campaigning has taken place for ever a week with candidates vicing, with their personalities and qualifications, for the three positions available.

Now that the election is over, these students must realize the seriousness of their jobs. The preamble of the constitution states, "...to encourage initiative cooperation, and responsibility among the members of this college; to promote the common interest and general welfare of the college body; to maintain and perpetuate high ideals in this college;..." This sums up what must now become the per sonal interest of these newly elected members. The rest of the student body can honestly and earnestly expect this of all members on the council, not just the new members.

Besides the honorary position in which they have been placed, these new officers must take an oath of allegiance (at least to themselves) not only to the college, but to the students who had faith enough to elect them to the student-faculty governing body of the college.

Just because these council members have an obligation to the students, does not mean the students have no obligation to the council members.

RICE, SVEC, AND LARSON TOP THREE IN FOURTH COLLEGE COUNCIL ELECTION.

The Electoral Board announced late last night the final tally of the college council election which placed three first-year students, Ray Rice, Carolyn, and Chris Larson, officially in the three council slots available.

The board, composed of Miss Helen Gore, Miss Margaret, Manigold, and Bill Miller, began counting votes immediately after the polls closed at 5 o'clock Wednesday, and reached a total late in the evening.

They stated that all thirteen contenders for the positions were in close contest most of the way, but Rice, Svec, and Larsent pulled ahead and maintained their lead sufficiently enough to keep themselves out of tanger.

In the record vote by the studentfaculty college body, Rice came in first, Svec second, and Larsen Third. Last year 86% of the college body voted, this year the figure may exceed that with over 145 of a possible 170 students voting.

The heavy vote was recorded in the morning. By noon over 100 students had voted, and by 4 o'clock woting had ceased completely.

The first college council meeting for the new members will take place this after noon at one o'cleck in room 26. All 'wet-cran' council members will be on hand to welcome the new student representatives.

They will take their seats in council, and begin their dutys immediately.
