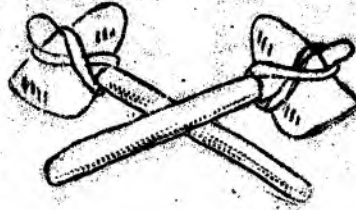

ELECTION RESULTS

Northwestern Michigan College's polls closed yesterday at 8 a.m., with the names of eleven candidates appearing on the ballot. Seeking election to the College Council were seven first year and four second year students. Four of these candidates were girls.

More than half of the students cast their ballots in the first two and a half hours of balloting. This is an indication of the feeling that had built up through the campaigning preceding the election. It also shows the strong interest which our students have in their right of personal representation through the College Council.

When the polls closed at 4 p.m., a total of 156 ballots had been cast, and by 5 p.m. the results had been tabulated by the electoral commission.

Jim Clancy, Doug Brandon, Bob Irish and Bob Hopkins won out over their opponents in one of the closest elections in the college's history.

The commission reported that four ballots had to be discarded because of improper marking. They also stated that if the ballots of the 53 students, who neglected to take advantage of their right to vote, had been cast, the entire election picture might have been changed.
